

McBath Home

Doctor McBath bought the house in 1922 when he moved from Eastanollee to Toccoa. He and his family lived upstairs while he practiced medicine in the basement. After Dr. McBath died, his wife, Ella Davis McBath, stayed in the home until she died in 1947. The house was left to their daughter, Ruth McBath. Ruth turned the house into a boarding house for teachers. When Ruth died in 1987, the house was turned into apartments and a doctor's office. In 2007 Dr. Kay Royal bought the house to use for Family Eye Care.
